

On the 80th anniversary of the 467th's final mission (25 Apr 45) of the war, the long-awaited arrival of the scale model of 42-52534 'Witchcraft' arrived home to the Historic Wendover Airfield.

"After nearly 6 years, the odyssey of creating a memorial at the Historic Wendover Airfield was finally coming to an end. It all started when I had the idea to honor the men from the 467th Bombardment Group (H) who trained there before their overseas movement to their final station of Rackheath, England. As the Vice President of the 467th Bombardment Group (H) Association, I knew it was our mission to "keep alive the memory and the heroic sacrifices of its members" and "to perpetuate the Group through memorials, both domestic and foreign". Just like our predecessors in the Association had done in the past with the 8th Air Force Museum in Pooler, GA., the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, CO., and Balboa Park in San Diego, CA., it felt right to reach out to the membership for donations to make this memorial a reality in Wendover"

In 2019, J. Peter Horne, the then Vice President of the 467th Bombardment Group Association (467th BGA), proposed to the membership assembled at the Association's annual reunion (held that year in Hartford, Connecticut) the idea to provide for display at The Historic Wendover Army Airfield a scale model of a B-24 to commemorate the men of the 467th Bombardment Group (H) (467th BG). As Wendover was the Group's final training facility prior to departing overseas, it is fitting that the 467th BG be appropriately represented at this significant location.

"Over the course of nearly six years, I had the privilege of witnessing the creation of the B-24 'Witchcraft' model. Each component of 'The Witch' was meticulously recreated in 1/20th scale using handcrafted aluminum. The level of accuracy and attention to detail was so remarkable that it was almost as if the aircraft could once again take to the skies. The long wait for the final shipping process to complete was almost too much to bear"

'Witchcraft', one of the original aircraft assigned to the 467th BG at Wendover, was selected as the theme for this memorial due of her unparalleled accomplishments. The 467th BGA was fortunate to select Guillermo Rojas-Bazan as the individual responsible for creating the model of 'Witchcraft'. Guillermo Rojas-Bazan is a globally recognized artist renowned for crafting exquisite aluminum scratch



-built models of vintage aircraft. This particular B-24 model of 'Witchcraft' is likely to serve as his final testament after nearly seven decades of dedicated craftsmanship.

"The date of arrival was to be the 24th of April. I made the long drive from my home to Wendover, arriving on the 23rd. With the help of Keith Hughes, the Association's Treasurer, I monitored its progress as the model traveled across the country from the point she was created to her final destination. Surprisingly, when I arrived the report I received was that she had "completed delivery" to her final destination. Oh the excitement knowing that in the morning I would finally see this marvelous creation.

It was, however, not to be on this morning. After spending at least an hour searching the extensive airfield, we were unable to find any trace of the package. What the heck! The progress report clearly stated that she had been delivered, was signed for by 'NSR', and left in a safe place. Further investigation revealed that she was at the final shipper and was due to be delivered now on the 25th."

As the 467th BGA conducted further research, they uncovered a staggering statistic: over 15,500 men and women had lost their lives nationwide during training and ferrying accidents. Recognizing the significance of these unrecognized heroes, the 467th BGA resolved to expand the memorial to honor not only those from the 467th BG, who were lost while training at the base, but also for those who perished nationwide. This expansion is being further developed by The Historic Wendover Airfield in creating a national memorial to honor these men and women, many of whom had yet to be assigned a combat unit and whose sacrifices had not been recorded in unit histories or collective memory.

"I spent the remainder of that day working on updating the kiosk presentation. Later in the day, Landon Whipkey from the airfield asked if I wanted to visit the crash site of 'The Forgotten Crew' which has recently been rediscovered. Of course I said yes and off we went. The location is about 10 miles to the northeast of the airfield at the top of one of the nearby mountains. At the time of the crash he Army had built a road (well, sort of) to the location of the crash site. While the first portion of the road is navigable in a 4 wheel- drive

vehicle the last bit is quite daunting. I tried to "Give it a go", but the loose gravel and steep grade made it clear that my vehicle wasn't cut out for it. Had a little excitement as I tried to back out of my predicament when I got to a spot where I started to teeter on two wheels. The rest of the journey had to be made on foot (with many a pause to catch my breath).



Finally the day came when 'The Witch' Around noon I noticed a would arrive. white truck parked nearby. Could this be her? Yes, it was. As Jim Petersen (Director of the airfield) went to grab a fork lift, the back of the truck opened and there was the crate that was made for her I tried to maintain a cool journey. composure, however, I must admit it was hard to do. The base at Wendover is so special, and the significance of the moment as she symbolically came home to where it all started for her was not lost on me.


The crate was carefully lifted off the

truck and placed on the ground nearby. This was the moment. One screw at a time, the top was removed, and there she was—safe and sound. I hesitated for a moment, unsure of what to do next. But then, I reached in, gently picked her up, and brought her inside to start the final installation.

The installation was a real challenge. How to hang her? What points to use without damaging the model? How to achieve an angle that looked dramatic, allowing all aspects of the model to be easily viewed? And, of course, dealing with the limitations of the display case being small with only one side able to be removed.

But with the help of some of the members of the airfield staff, we were able to get 'The Witch' safely secured in her final resting place.

It'll take some time for the full impact of this moment to sink in. In the moment one is focused on the task at hand, however, as I've had time to reflect, I'm so grateful for the opportunity to properly honor the men of the 467th BG. I'm so deeply indebted to everyone who's made this possible.






The memorial dedicated to the 467th Bombardment Group (H) comprises a kiosk that showcases the group's historical narrative. Additionally, a presentation is offered to one of the crews that lost their lives during training, known as the "Forgotten Crew." A photo gallery from the archives of the 467th BGA is also available, featuring images captured during the 467th's training at Wendover Army Air Base. Furthermore, a comprehensive account is provided detailing the background of the models creation, the modeler, and the donors who supported this project.

In addition, a display is being constructed to narrate the tale of "The Forgotten Crew." The display will convey an account of the incident, accompanied by related photographs, and will incorporate select remnants of the ship that perished.



Finally, the primary focus of the memorial is the display case housing the model of "Witchcraft." Within the case are plaques: one honoring the legacy of the 467th Bombardment Group (H), another commemorating the over 15,500 men and women who lost their lives during training and overseas movements, and one acknowledging the significant donors to this project.

(Editor: sincere appreciation on behalf of the Association to Peter for his effort, energies, and personal endeavor seeing this project through, so too Jim Petersen CEO, and the volunteers and staff at the Historic Wendover Airfield. A dedication and remembering the 15,500 "lost" is to be held possibly later this year.)



Historic Keepsake



The pictured item depicting a Parachute Log Record was posted on the Group Facebook Page in March by **Will Currie**. He briefly stated it belonged to his late grandfather and, "thought this group would find this interesting".

Given the date recorded of 29 Dec. 1944 when the "shute" was successfully deployed, it didn't take too long to

identify both the crew and crew member it belonged. Will Currie confirmed his grandfather was Sgt. Virgil D. Miller of the 789th Squadron, Lt John F. Moffette Crew.

The Lt. John Moffette Crew flying their 13th mission were involved in the infamous "fog" mission of 29 December 1944. The B24H 42-94881 departing in thick fog hit trees far end of the runway causing damage to the undercarriage and a fire to #3 engine. The pilot, Lt. Moffette was able to gain sufficient altitude before ordering the crew to bale out the stricken aircraft and setting the ship on auto to head out to sea. All crew baled out and survived, one receiving leg and ankle injuries. Interestingly, Sgt Glenn Coolidge of the crew after baling out made contact with a Norfolk family and chose to stay with them for a few days before reporting back to Rackheath. In the meantime he was posted "MIA" and a telegram sent to his mother who had received a previous "MIA" telegram referring to Glenn Coolidge's brother, Lt. Myles E. Coolidge (also at Rackheath) who had been shot-down flying as copilot in August 1944. Fortunately Myles was one of two who survived and was taken POW, returning home after the war.





Letter from Rackheath

It is now some five years since I founded the Rackheath Pathfinders. The plan to restore as far as possible Site#6, the former Mess site of the 467th BG (H). The aim was to enhance what had become a piece of rough scrubland that nature had encroached and reclaimed over the past seventy years or so.

Where once daily almost three thousand personnel would have eaten, showered, watched films and officers held parties in the Sword and Chain Club. Almost nothing remained visible above ground level. Self set trees and undergrowth covered the entire site and the resulting decomposing vegetation had buried everything.


The task ahead was enormous but never daunting because we had the vision and the determination to uncover the infrastructure that was long lost to view. The purpose of this endeavour was to respect and cultivate the history and the narrative of the 467th BG (H) with the enduring bond of friendship between us, both sides of the pond.

The completion of the Quartermasters Dodge Command Car.

In the last "POOP" I reported the restoration of the former Dodge Command Car and road trials were being conducted. For the past three and a half years I have had the privilege to witness this meticulous restoration project by my dear friend Maurice Hammond at his Hardwick facility and hangar. What an absolute thrill it was to be driven by Maurice in a vehicle that originally some eighty plus years ago was at Rackheath!! Watch the brief video-clip.

Inhabiting the underground foul drainage system at Site#6 we have known for around three years there is a large colony of European cave spiders. They are hardly ever seen above ground as they do not like the daylight. Surprisingly one ventured out while we were working on repairing a drain gully outside the officers kitchen one Saturday. Although they are not a protected species, they are rare in the sense that they are very under reported because of their habitat being underground, they are very rarely seen.

It is most rewarding to see, listen and engage with young children who are aware of the Americans presence so long ago. Their questions and inquisitiveness was a delight to answer and respond. Leaving us in no doubt that the history and the narrative of the 467th BG (H) will live on in their collective memories also in the generations that follow.

Site#6 Information Leaflet.

Produced by Pathfinder, Paul Thorogood, with the idea to promote and publicize the work going on at Site#6 including the historic context and importance of the local site. The leaflet will be distributed to visitors during the 10 day "Silver Wings" exhibition at the Forum, Norwich, during September where the Pathfinders will have a stand and display.

The idea is also to have the leaflets available during the regular Saturday morning activity at Site#6, Newman Road, where visitors and passers-by frequently approach the volunteers with questions and enquiries. It is hoped the leaflets will further encourage other volunteers to "join-in" with the Pathfinders widening the potential skills base, increasing the voluntary workforce and enabling much wider exploration and reclamation of the extensive site area.

Who are we?

A Volunteer group of locals and Aviation Heritage enthusiasts. Formed in Spring 2020, we now meet every Saturday morning. Visitors are always welcome.

What do we do?

Uncovering the remains of Site 6, Newman Road, Rackheath and researching the history of those who served there during World War Two.



Who were the Rackheath Aggies?

Stationed at RAF Rackheath from February 1944 to July 1945 they flew B-24 Liberator 'Heavy' bombers to achieve the best overall accuracy in the Eighth Air Force and the highest rate of aircraft available for duty.



What is Site 6?

This was the location of the mess site for the 467th Bomb Group, United States Army Air Force — the 'Rackheath Aggies' Within this site can be found the remains of blast shelters, the Officers Club, the cinema, the various shower blocks and the kitchens. This is also the site of the 'White House' - the quarters of Commanding Officer Colonel Albert J. Shower who lived there for 14 months.
