1. **OUTLETS:** The following is excerpted from an A.M.W.D. letter for the information and guidance of all concerned:

"A.468 - Electrical Installations in Buildings. 1. A recent accident, which involved an outbreak of fire and the death of a N.C.O. by electric shock, was found, on enquiry, to have resulted from the fitting of unauthorized apparatus to the lighting circuit of a barrack hut. Attention is therefore drawn to A.M.C. 1236/43 as amended by A.574/44, which is republished below and which is to be strictly observed:

"2. C.O.s are reminded that Director of Works type electrical installation drawings for a building constitute the approved scale. Accordingly, prior approval of the superintending engineer concerned must be sought for any extension to an existing system, e.g. provision of a power point, increase in lamp wattages, etc.

"3. The above ruling applies equally to extensions which it is proposed should be carried out on a repayment basis and which will be connected to a non-entitled circuit.

"4. In view of the limited supplies of electrical materials and the limited installation labour available, C.O.s are to restrict their requests for extensions to existing systems to the minimum."

2. **OVER-CHARGING:** All members of this command are requested to report suspected instances of overcharging of American soldiers, in full detail, through command channels, in order that remedial action may be initiated by higher Headquarters in conjunction with civil authorities.

3. **PASSES, LEAVES, AND FURLOWNS:** TWK, 2d ED, U-568-C, is quoted for the information and compliance of all concerned:

"Cite U-507-C combat crew members on leave, furlough, or pass will have in their possession evidence indicating their combat crew status as well as duration of leave, furlough, or pass.
