2. 4. FIVE POUND NOTES: The following letter, Hq USSAFE, File 122.1, dtd 23 August 1944, is quoted for the information and compliance of all concerned, this Command:

"1. The British Government is extremely desirous that no five pound (£5) notes leave the United Kingdom. It is the desire of this command to extend active cooperation on this matter.

"2. Finance Officers outside the United Kingdom are not authorized to cash or exchange English sterling notes of denominations higher than one pound (£1)."
